National Public Health Week is April 1 – 7, 2024

This year's theme is "Protecting, Connecting and Thriving: We Are All Public Health."

Central Michigan District Health Department (CMDHD) and the Northern Michigan Public Health Alliance (NMPHA) are celebrating National Public Health Week (NPHW) from April 1 – 7, 2024. CMDHD's goal is to promote health and physical well-being. We do this by offering preventive services and information for adults and kids, including immunizations and other programs, such as WIC. We also work to stop diseases from spreading, help with emergency preparedness, keep our environment safe, advocate for harm reduction, and support reproductive health.

"National Public Health Week is a time to reflect on our efforts to improve the health of our communities," said Steve Hall, CMDHD Health Officer. "Public health employees work daily to improve others' lives, and we are proud of how much our staff cares about our communities."
